And as by Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, "That if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same, at or near to the Place of his Residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the Place of his Residence, in the Manner pointed out in the said Act." Notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending the 30th June 1806, will commence paying on the 6th October next; and all Persons who are desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
