of the Plantation, on which fuch Sugar or Coffee -was actually produced, or his or her Agent or Manager, fpecifying the Quantity of fuch Sugar or Coffee, and the Number and Weight of the Packages, containing the fame respectively, the Name or Defcription of the Plantation, where the fame, and the Year in which the fame actually grew, and addreffed to the Collector or other principal Officer of His Majelty's Cultoms, and fuch Collector or other principal Officer, shall caufe the faid Packages to be duly weighed and examined, and if the fame fhall be found to correspond with such Application, and the Sugar or Coffee contained therein shall be proved on the Oath of the Party, or otherwife, to the Satisfaction of fuch Collector or other principal Officer to be, bonâ fide, the Growth or Produce of the Plantation mentioned as deferibed in fuch Application, he shall cause the same to be so stamped or marked in the Order in which fuch Applications shall have been made, and not otherwife; provided alfo, that in cafe Application shall be To made in any One Year, ending the Thirty-first of December; for stamping or marking a greater Quantity of Sugar than 5,880,000 lbs., that Quan-tity, and no more, shall be fo stamped or marked, and the Remainder shall be stamped or marked in the next Year in the Order in which Application shall have been made for the same, successively, unless the Proprietor, &c. shall be willing that fuch Sugar or Coffee shall be stamped or marked as Foreign, in Manner hereafter-mentioned, and exported as such from the faid Ifland ; and that all Sugar and Coffee, not being the Produce of the British Plantations or Territories, shall, upon Importation into the Port of Road Harbour, be laid on Land, and examined, and shall be deposited in safe and secure Warehouses, under the joint Locks of His Majefty, and the Owner or Proprietor of fuch Sugar and Coffee; and the fame shall not afterwards be shipped or laden on board any Ship or Veffel, unless directly from fuch Warehoufes, (upon due Entry thereof being first made,) under the Care and Infpection of the proper Officer of the Customs; and before any fuch Sugar or Coffee shall be permitted or fuffered to be shipped or laden on board any Ship or Veffel, each and every Package shall be stamped or marked by the proper Officer of the Cultoms, in Roman Letters of not lefs than Two Inches in Length, with the Word FOREIGN, and shall be also numbered progreffively :

And His Majefty is further pleafed to order, by and with the Advice aforefaid, and in purfuance of the Powers vefted in Him, with the Advice aforefaid, by the faid first mentioned Act, that the Importation into the Post of Road Harbour, and the Exportation from theuce, of all Sugar whatfoever, shall be permitted, without Payment of any Dury of Cuftoms, under and subject to the Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions beforementioned; and further, that all Sugar imported into the United King-dom of Great Britain and Ireland from the faid Island of Tortola, shall be deemed and taken to be Foreign Sugar, and be imported into the United Kingdom as fuch, and fubject to the Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions relating thereto, except fuch Sugar as shall actually be of the Growth and Produce of the British Virgin Islands, and exported as fuch, under the Certificate of the Collector and Comptroller of the Cuftoms of the faid Island, in I

Manner and Form hereunto annexed; which Certificates thall not be given in any One Year for any greater Quantity than Five Millions Eight Hundred and Eighty Thoufand Pounds Weight :--And the Right Honorable the Lords Commifficients of His Majefty's Treafury, and the Lords Commifficients of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.
