

The Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain; and for reviving and continuing several Laws relating to the permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or other Provisions, and to the permitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Fish, and Provisions, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight; and for reviving and continuing an Act, passed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for the Encouragement of the Flaxen and Hempen Manufactures of Ireland until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven; and for amending and further continuing an Act made in the Seventh Year of His present Majesty for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine."

His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Sixteenth of April last, to permit for the Space of Six Months, from the Date of the said Order, the Importation of sundry Articles of Provisions, therein specified, Duty free: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Sixteenth of this instant October, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be so imported with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to, in an Act passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty; and the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it hath been represented to His Majesty, that, over and above the Royal Duties, and the Consulate or Municipal Duties, payable upon divers Articles exported from the City, Town, and Fortrefs of Buenos Ayres, and its Depend-

cies, including therein all and every the Territories belonging to, or forming a Part of, the Government of the same, a Duty of Two Reals upon each Ox Hide, and of One Real upon each Horse Hide, exported, was levied and paid during the Time the said City, Town, and Fortrefs of Buenos Ayres, and its Dependencies, were under the Spanish Government: And whereas the Commander of His Majesty's Forces, to whom the said City, Town, and Fortrefs have surrendered, has thought fit, until His Majesty's Pleasure should be known, to reduce the said additional Duty to One Real upon each Ox Hide, and to make a proportionate Reduction of the Duty payable upon each Horse Hide exported; His Majesty is thereupon pleased to order and declare, that the said Reduced Duties, and no other, shall, until the further Signification of His Majesty's Pleasure, continue to be paid upon each Ox Hide and Horse Hide exported as aforesaid, in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; or in Ships *bonâ fide* belonging to any of the Subjects or Native Inhabitants of the said City, Town, and Territories, such Native Inhabitants being peaceably resident within the same, and under the Obedience of His Majesty's Government there:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT is this Day ordered by His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, that Horses, Mules, Asses, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and every other Species of Live Stock and Live Provisions, be added to the Articles which His Majesty, by His Order in Council of the Seventeenth of last Month, has authorized the Governors and Lieutenant-Governors of His Majesty's Islands and Colonies in the West Indies, (in which Description the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer's Islands, are included,) and of any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majesty belonging, to permit to be imported into the said Islands, Colonies, Lands, and Territories respectively; and that the said additional Articles be accordingly permitted to be so imported, in the Manner, for the Time, and under the Terms and Conditions mentioned in the said Order.
