A PROCLAMATION,

For dissolving this present Parliament, and declaring the Culling of another.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS We think sit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve whe present Parliament, which stands prorogued to Wednesday the Twenty-ninth Day of this instant: October, and which was to be further prorogued on the faid Twenty ninth Day of this instant October, to Thursday the Twenty-seventh Day of November -next: We do therefore publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the faid Parliament accordingly; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Civizens, and Burgesles, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are discharged from their Meeting and Attendance on the said Wednesday the Twentyninth Day of this instant October, and on the faid Thursday the Twenty-seventh Day of November next. And We being defirous and refolved, as foon .25 may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our Royal Will and Plea-fure to call a new Parliament: And do hereby further declare, that, with the Advice of Our Privy :Council, We have this Day given Order that Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, and Our Chancellor of Ireland, do respectively forthwith issue out Writs, in due Form and according to Law, for calling a new Par-Tiament. And We do hereby also, by this Our's Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require Writs forthwish to be affued accordingly by Our said Chancellors respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, who are to serve in Oursaid Parliament, to be duly returned to, and give their Attendance in, Our said Parliament; which Writs are to be returnable on Monday the Fifteenth Day of December. next.

A PROCLAMATION.

In order to the Eleding and Summaning the Sixteen
Peers of Scotland.

WHEREAS We have, in Our Council, thought fit to declare Our Pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on Monday the Fifteenth Day of December next enluing the Date hereof: In order therefore to the electing and fummoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to fit in the House of Peers in the faid Parliament; We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to affemble and meet at Holy Rood Flouse, in Edinburgh, on Thursday the Fourth Day of December next ensuing, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choose the Sixtees Peers to fit and vote in the House of Peers, in the faid ensuing Parliament, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then prefent, and of the Proxies of fuch as shall be absent, (fuch Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing, duly figned before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law). And the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and immediately after such Election made, and duly examined, to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers to elected, and fign and attell the same, in the Prefence of the faid Peers the Electors; and return such Certificate into Qur High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We do, by this Our Proclamation, firietly command and require the Frovost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial Care to preserve the Peace thereof, during the Time of the said Election; and to prevent all Manner of Riots, Tumults, Diforders, and Violence whatsoever. And We strictly charge and command, that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Crois at Edin-
