The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. -

W HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty first Day of May laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwile; Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Am. munition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of De-cember next : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfor ever, (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnauce for His Majefty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of December next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaltwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incur-ring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majelty's Reign, intituled "An "Act to empower His Majelty to prohibit the "Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce the "Law for empowering. His Majelty to prohibit "the Exportation of Gunnowder, or any Sort of " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and allo to empower " His Majelty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of "Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or "Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commillioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majelty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpec-W. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IS Majefty having received Affurances on the Part of the King of Pruffia, that he will neither give, nor fuffer to be given, in any of the

Ports of His Dominions, any Impediment whatever to a free Navigation of the Subjects of His Majefty, but will give to the British Flag the Liberty of en-tering into all the abovementioned Ports, and of Dcparture from the fame, as before the last closing of the Rivers Ems, Wefer, and Elbe; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is gracioufly pleafed to order, and it is hereby ordered, That Instructions shall be immediately issued to the Commanders of His Majelly's Ships of War and Privateers, that they give no Interruption, in future, to the innocent Navigation of the Subjects of His Pruffian Majefty, and of the Inhabitants of the Town of Pappenburgh, whole Commerce it is His Majefty's Intention shall be left free, and replaced on the fame Footing on which it was previous to the last Exclusion of the British Flag from the Rivers Ems, Weler, and Elbe: And His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; the Lords Commisfioners of the Admiralty, the Judges of the High Court of Admiralty, and of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, will give the neceffary Orders accordingly, as to them shall respectively appertain.

AM much gratified in transmitting you, for the Information of the Lords Committioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter I have just received from Captain Brifbane, of the Arethula, acquainting me of the Capture of His Catholic Majelly's Fri-gate Pomona, the Deftruction of Twelve Gun-Boats, and the Explosion of a Castle, mounting Six. teen Thirty-fix-Pounders, by that Ship and the Anfon.

The Succels attending this bold Enterprize, I truft their Lordihips will agree with me, Captain Brifbane was well entitled to, for the Promptuels and Decifion with which he anchored in fuch Shoal Water, to attack a Force of fuch Magnitude. The Destruction of the Gun-Boats was occasioned by the Anson's well-directed Fire. The Conduct of all concerned will, I truft, be honoured by their Lordfhips' Approbation.

Arethufa, off the Havannah, Augu/1 23, 1806.

SIR, HAVE the Honour to inform you of a fuccefs-ful Attack having been made by His Majetty's Ships Arethufa and Anfon on the Enemy near the Moro Caftle, in the Island of Cubas on the Morning of the 23d Inftant.

The Refult has been the Capture of the Spanish Frigate Pomona, of Thirty-eight Guns, with a Complement of Three Hundred and Forty-leven Men, and the Destruction of Twelve Gun Boats, each carrying a Twenty-four-Pounder, with a Com-plement of an Hundred Men each, and the Explotion of a Caltle mounting Sixteen Thirty-fix-Pounders.
