Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that on Wednesday the 12th Instant, about Eight

o'Clock in the Evening, the House of Mrs. Margaret Baldwin, of Broadfield, near Plaxtol, in Kent, was attacked by Eight or Ten Men, with White Veils over their Faces, who, after having secured the Servants by Threats and Fire Arms, compelled Mrs. Baldwin, who is about Eighty-seven Years of Age, to open all her Bureaus and Closets above and below Stairs, that they might search them. They found Money and Bills to the Amount of 105l. and several Articles of Plate. The Men, Two of whom were dressed in Blue Jackets and Caps, resembling those of Artillery Waggon Drivers, and the others in Red Jackets, resembling those of Foot Soldiers, continued in the House an Hour and an Half, and were all armed with Horse Pistols. The following is the Description of the Plate stolen, viz. A large Silver Tankard marked R M B on the Handle, at the Bottom of it Robert Baldwin, Broadfield; a Silver Cup, marked R B; a Silver Waiter with Three Legs, Eleven Silver Table Spoons, one large Gravy Spoon, a Pair of Saltcellers B; Five Table Spoons, Two marked R M B; One Pepper-Box and Marrow Spoon.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Burglary, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them who shall discover his Accomplices therein, so that they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
