WE, whose Names are hereunder-written, being Five of the Commissioners named and authorized in and by His Majesty's Commission under the Great Seal of Great Britain, bearing Date at Westminster the Twenty-ninth Day of September One thousand eight hundred and six, do, by virtue of the said Commission, and in pursuance of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to vest certain Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments in Trustees, for better securing His Majesty's Docks, Ships, and Stores, at Portsmouth, and for extending the Lines and Works at Dover," hereby give Notice to all and every Person and Persons who have, or claim to have, any Estate, Right, Title, or Interest to or in the Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, hereinafter particularly set forth, that is to say;—all that Piece, or Parcel of Land, (being Part of the Waste Lands of the Manor and Borough of Gosport, belonging to the See of Winchester,) containing, by Estimation, exclusive of the Sea Beach, Ten Acres, or thereabouts, be the same more or less, and abutted and bounded as in the said Act mentioned; and also so much and such Part of a certain Road or Way as abuts on the North Side of the said Piece or Parcel of Waste Land, (ave
