I fell in with, and after a short Chace, captured the Guadaloupe, a French Schooner Privateer, mounting Three 6-Pounders (Two of which were thrown overboard in the Chace,) and Fifty-four Men. She had been Four Days from Guadaloupe, and made no Capture.

I HAVE the Honour to inform you, that, on the Night of the 2d inst. Mr. King, Acting Master, in the Cutter of His Majesty's Brig under my Command, brought out Two Sloops, Manette and Dolphin, laden with Sugar and Rum, from under the Batteries near St. Pierre's, Martinico.

I have also the Honour to inform you, that I captured, on the 4th instant, the French National Schooner La Chiffone, armed with Musketry, employed as a Dispatch Vessel between Guadaloupe and Martinico.
