APROCLAMATION,
GEORGER.

I HEREAS by Our Order in Council, bearing Date the Twentieth Day of January last, the Time prescribed by Our Several Proclamations now in force for the Payment of the Bounties promifed by Our faid Proclamations, for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into Our Royal Navy; and the Rewards for discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, so that such Seamen should be taken for Our Service; and also the Rewards to Persons who should procure the voluntary Service of Able and Ordinary Seamen and Landmen, fit for Our Naval Service, and should convey fuch Seamen and Landmen on board of any of Our Ships and Veffels, or to any of Our Sea Officers employed in raising Men, has been continued until the Thirty-first Day of this instant December; which Bounties and Rewards are as follows; that is to fay,-To every Able Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should enter himself to serve in Our Royal Navy, a Bounty of Five Pounds; and to every Ordinary Seaman, so entering himself, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, a Bounty of Three Pounds; -to every able-bodied. Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, noraunder the Age-of Eighteen Years, fo entering himfelf, a Bounty of Thirty Shillings ;- to any Person or Persons who shall discover any Able or Ordimary Seaman or Seamen who may have concealed; themselves, so that such Seaman may be taken for Our Service, by any of Our Officers employed to raise Men, a Reward of Three Pounds for every Auch Able Seaman, and Eifty Shillings for every fuch-Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board Our Ships ;to any Person or Persons who shall procure the vo-Juntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen fit, for Our Service, and shall convey them on board any of Our Ships or Vessels, or to any of Our

Sea Officers employed in railing Men, a Reward of Four Guineas for every fuch Able Seaman, Three Guineas for every fuch Ordinary Seaman, and Two Guineas and a Half for every such Landman; together with an Allowance, at the Rate of One Penny per Mile, for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile fuch Men may respectively travel to the nearest of Our Ships of War, or nearest Place of Residence of any of Our Sea Officers employed in railing Men; provided fuch; Man shall be found fit for Our Service, and there shall not be Reason to suppose that he is an Apprentice: -And whereas it has been represented to Us, that it is expedient that the faid several Bounties and Rewards should be continued until the Thirtyfirst Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seven, fave and except only that the Rewards to Persons who shall procure the voluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen fit for Our Naval Service, and shall convey them on board of any of Our Ships or Vessels, or to any of Our Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, should be decreased, We have therefore, thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council to declare, and We do hereby declare, that, from and after the Thirty first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and fix, to, and until the Thirty-first Day of December One thoufand eight hundred and feven, a Reward of Three Guineas, and no more, for every such Able Seaman; Two Guineas, and no more, for every fuch Ordinary Seaman; and One Guinea, and no more, for every such Landman, shall be paid to any Person who may procure the voluntary Service of any fuch Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, or Landman, together with the fame Allowance for their travelling Expences, and with the same Provisos, as are specified in Our faid Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Seventh Day of November, One thousand eight hundred and five :-- And We do hereby, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, further promise and declare, that all other Bounties and Rewards

granted by Our several Proclamations now in sorce, and declared by Our said Order in Council of the said Twentieth Day of January last to be continued to, and until the said Thirty first Day of this instant December, One thousand eight hundred and six, for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into Our Royal Navy, and for the discovering of Seamen who may conceal themselves, shall continue to be paid in the Manner specified in Our said Proclamations respectively, to and until the Thirty-first Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seven.

Given at Our Court at the Queen's Palace, the Twenty-second Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and six, and in the Forty-seventh Year of Our Reign.

'HE Commissioners, agreeably to the Directions which have been received from the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do hereby give Notice to all Merchants, Traders, Brokers, Agents, and others whom it may concern, that, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, no Fee, Perquifite, Gratuity, or Reward, whether pecuniary, or of any other Sort or Description whatever, can legally be required, taken, or received by any Officer, Clerk, or other Person executing or performing, or affishing in the Execution or Persormance of any of the Duties, or acting in any of the Offices or Employments in, or belonging to, His Majesty's Customs in the Port of London, enumerated or described in the following Table marked A), for any Service, Act, Duty, Matter, or Thing done or performed, or to be done or performed, by any or either of fuch Officer, Officers, Clerk, or Clerks, or other Person or Persons, on account of, or relating to, any such Office or Employment; and if any fuch Officer, Clerk, or other Person shall, at any Time after the 10th Day of October 1806, require, take, or receive any Pec, Perquifite, Gratuity, or Reward, whether pecuniary, or of any other Sort or Description whatever, either directly or indirectly, on account of, or relating to, any fuch Office or Employment, or for any Service, Act, Duty, Matter, or Thing done or performed, or to be done or performed therein, although the same shall be freely offered or given, every fuch Officer, Clerk, or other Person so offending will, on Proof thereof, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, or any Four or more of them, be, for the first Offence, peremptorily difmissed from his Office or Employment, in pursuance of the Directions of the faid Act, and be rendered o incapable of ever again holding or executing, or act-
