FORM of LICENCE directed by the above Order.

By the Commissioners for managing and causing to be levied and collected His Majesty's Customs, Subsidies, and other Duties in [where]

WHEREAS [Name of the Person] one of His Majesty's Subjects, residing at [Place where] hath given Notice to us the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs [in Great Britain, or Revenue in Ireland] that he intends to lade at [some Port of the United States of America] and import into [some Port of Newfoundland] in the [Ship's Name] being a British-built Ship [describing the Tonnage and what Sort of Vessel] navigated according to Law, whereof [Master's Name] is Master, bound to [where]; and it appearing by the Register of the said Ship the [Ship's Name] whereof [Master's Name] is Master, that the said Ship the [Ship's Name] was built at [Place where] and owned by [Owner's Name] residing at [Place where] all His Majesty's British Subjects; and that no Foreigner, directly or indirectly, hath any Share, Part, or Interest therein.

Now be it known, that the said [Person's Name] hath a Licence to lade on board the said Ship, [Ship's Name] at and from any Port or Place belonging to the United States of America, Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live-Stock, the Produce of the said United States, and no other Article whatever; and to carry the said Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock to some Port or Place in the Island of Newfoundland; and on the Arrival of the said Ship at any Port, Harbour, or Place of Discharge in Newfoundland, the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of the said Ship, is required and enjoined to deliver up the said Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of His Majesty's Customs there, and to endorse on the Back thereof the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and the Number of Live Stock, and shall thereupon receive a Certificate thereof from the said Collector, or other proper Officer of the Customs.

AT the Council Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 4th of *February 1807*,

P R E S E N T,

The Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty annually to train and exercise a Proportion of His Subjects in England under certain Regulations, and more effectually to provide for the Defence of the Realm;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall be lawful for His Majesty on any Returns then made, or which should thereafter be made, of the Numbers of Persons liable to serve in the Militia in the several Counties in England, under any Act then in force, or under any Act which might be passed in that Session of Parliament, to direct His Privy Council to take such Returns into Consideration, and to apportion any Number of Men, not exceeding 200,000, among the said Counties, according to the Number so returned, and thereupon to direct that the Numbers so apportioned should be transmitted to the respective Lieutenants of the said Counties, (Notice whereof should be thereupon Thrice printed in the London Gazette;) and that such Lieutenants should, immediately after the last Publication of such Notice, summon General and Subdivision Meetings of Lieutenancy in their respective Counties; and that at such General Meetings the Numbers so fixed for each respective County should be divided and apportioned among the Hundreds of such respective Counties; and at such Subdivision Meetings, the Numbers so apportioned among each respective Hundred should be divided and apportioned among the Parishes of such respective Hundreds, in the Manner then in Use with respect to the Militia:—And whereas under a certain Act, passed in the same Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for the Return of correct Lists of Persons liable to serve in the Militia under an Act passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty, and to suspend the Ballot for the Militia in England for Two Years;" Returns have been made of the Numbers of Persons liable to serve in the Militia in the several Counties in England, conformable to the Forms prescribed by certain Schedules thereto annexed; And whereas His Majesty hath been pleased by His Order in Council of the Fourth instant, made in pursuance of the said Act first above-mentioned, to direct His Privy Council to take the said last-mentioned Returns into Consideration, and to apportion Two Hundred Thousand Men among the said Counties, according to the Number so returned, and thereupon to direct that the Numbers so apportioned shall be transmitted to the respective Lieutenants of the said Counties, and be Thrice printed in the London Gazette, for the Purposes mentioned and expressed in the said Act; His Majesty's Privy
