WHereas it has been represented to the King, that about Eight o'Clock, on Friday Evening the 16th Instant, a most daring and atrocious Robbery was committed in the House of Mr. Fox, of Rye-Hill, in the Parish of Kilmington, in the County of Lincoln, by Five Men disguised and disfigured, and armed with Pistols, a Gun, and other Weapons, who rushed into the House, and threatened to murder Mr. and Mrs. Fox; compelled them to shew where their Money and Valuables were deposited, and afterwards rifled and plundered them of every Thing they thought fit to take;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Felony, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them who shall discover his Accomplices therein, so that they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
