

finite Treaty of Peace, unless His Majesty shall, in the mean time, otherwise order and declare, the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, and the Dependencies thereof, shall and may be carried on in any Ships or Vessels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects, owned and navigated according to Law; and in Trading Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of States in Amity with His Majesty, of whatever Burthen, or in whatever Manner navigated; and in any Ship or Vessel belonging to any Person or Persons whatsoever, of whatsoever Description, and howsoever navigated, to which His Majesty may be graciously pleased to grant His Royal Licence or Authority for that Purpose; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, are to give the necessary Directions therein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that about Eight o'Clock on the Evening of the 27th January last, Patrick Reed, a Private Soldier belonging to the Third Battalion of the First (or Royal) Regiment of Foot, whilst standing Sentry at the Tower of Culvercroft Battery, in Sussex, was accosted by a Man dressed in a great Coat, round Hat and Cockade, (who appeared to be an Officer's Servant,) and who, after some Conversation, fired (as is supposed) a Pistol at the said Patrick Reed, the Ball of which passed through his Knee; and whereas the said Patrick Reed has since died of the said Wound;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Person who committed the said Murder, is hereby pleased to offer a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person who shall dis-
