finitive Treaty of Peace, unless His Majefty fhall, in the mean time, otherwife order and declare, the Trade and Commerce to and from the Ifle of Malta, and the Dependencies thereof, fhall and may be carried on in any Ships or Veffels belonging to any of His Majefty's Subjects, owned and navigated ac-cording to Law; and in Trading Ships or Veffels belonging to the Subjects of States in Amity with His Majelty, of whatever Burthen, or in whatever Manner navigated; and in any Ship or Veffel be-longing to any Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, of whatfoever Defeription, and howfoever navigated, to which His Majefty may be graciously pleased to grant His Royal Licence or Authority for that Purpofe; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
