The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Island of Curaçoa and its Dependencies have been surrendered and placed under the immediate Protection of His Majesty's Arms, and the Territory and Forts of the same have been delivered up to His Majesty, and the said Island is now in His Majesty's Possession; His Majesty is thereupon pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the said Island of Curaçoa, subject, nevertheless, to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Penalties, and Forfeitures to which the Trade to and from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, and Islands in the West Indies is or shall be subject by Law:

And His Majesty is further pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all Commodities, being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the said Island of Curaçoa, being in His Majesty's Possession, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Conditions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to coming from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, or Islands in the West Indies: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to His Majesty, that on the Evening of the 7th Instant, the Boats of the Tartar Cutter, in the Service of His Majesty's Customs, and of the Lively Cutter, in the Service of His Majesty's Excise; were feloniously fired on by the Crew of a Smuggling Lugger, with the Name obliterated, then lying in Folkestone Roads, which was afterwards seized by the Revenue Officers, and her Crew, consisting of Fourteen Men, taken out of her, and put on board the said Cutters, Seven of whom afterwards escaped from the Tartar, and Three were rescued from the Custody of the Peace Officers in the Town of Dover;

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the said Offenders who have escaped, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of them (except the Master of the said Lugger, and such of her Crew as actually fired) who will discover any one or more of the said Offenders who have escaped, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to His Majesty, that on the Evening of the 8th Instant, a very numerous Mob assembled in the Town of Dover for the Purpose of rescuing from the Custody of the Peace Officers several Smugglers, who stood charged with Felony; and that although Proclamation was made by the Mayor of the said Town for the Persons assembled to disperse themselves, and peaceably depart to their Habitations, or to their lawful Business, upon the Pains contained in the Act made in the First Year of the Reign of King George the First, for preventing Tumults and Riotous Assemblies, yet the said Mob, consisting of several Hundred Persons, did not disperse till the Arrival of a large Party of Cavalry and Infantry, about Two Hours after the said Proclamation, and succeeded in rescuing Three of the said Smugglers, and severely assaulted an Officer and a Private of the Shropshire Militia, and an Officer of the Royal Miners;

His Majesty, for better discovering and bringing to Justice the principal Persons engaged in the said Riot, and who, by not dispersing according to the said Proclamation, have committed Felony within the said Act, is pleased hereby to offer His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the said Rioters, (except those who actually committed Acts of Violence,) who will discover any one or more of his or their Accomplices, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said Felony.

THE Committee appointed to carry into Execution the Acts of Parliament for rendering more commodious, and for better regulating the Port of London, do hereby give Notice, that from and after Lady-Day next the Office for conducting the Harbour-Master's Business of the Port of London will be removed from No. 41, Fore-Street, Limehouse, to the Canal Office at Blackwall, and that the present Office in St. Katharine's-Square, below the Tower of London, will be continued as usual until further Notice; and the Committee have directed to be made public, for the Information of all Masters and Commanders of Ships, Vessels, and other Craft using or coming into the Port of London, as well as Pilots and all other Persons, the following Sections of the By-Laws for regulating the said Port, so far as relates to the Attendance of the First Harbour-Master at the Office nearest the Custom-House, and also the Attendance of the other Harbour-Masters at each Extremity of the Canal in the Isle of Dogs, viz.

Sec. 3. And be it further ordained and established by the Authority aforesaid, That the First Harbour-Master shall constantly attend every Day, and shall regularly superintend the Conduct and Management of the whole Duty afloat during the Flood Tide in the Course of each Day, and shall, during the remaining Hours, attend for the Transaction of all Public Business at the Office situate nearest the Custom House, or at such other Office or Place between the Tower of London and Blackwall aforesaid, as the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons in Common Council assembled, or any Committee or Committees appointed by them, shall deem necessary and proper, from Time to Time, to regulate and appoint in Writing; which Office shall continue open from Nine o'Clock in the Morning until Five o'Clock in the Afternoon each Day; and whenever the First Harbour-Master quits the said Office, a Notice in Writing shall be stuck up on the Door, or left in the Office, daily, announcing the Hour at which he means to return, for the Purpose of receiving any Communication relative to the Harbour-Service, upon Pain of forfeiting for every Default a Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, nor less than Ten Shillings

Sec. 14. and expeditious, the Entrance and Exit of all Ships or Vessels passing into, through, or out of the said Canal, on Pain of forfeiting for every Time when such Harbour-Master shall be found absent from his Duty in this Behalf, a Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, nor less than Ten Shillings.
