To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Aberdeen, in Council assembled.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's ever dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Aberdeen, beg Leave, at this interesting Juncture, to express, with all Humility, our just

and most grateful Sense of the many Blessings we enjoy under Your Majesty's auspicious Government, and particularly of the tender Solicitude, so recently manifested by Your Majesty to preserve inviolate that Security which the Laws of our Country afford to the Reformed Protestant Religion, which forms so essential a Part of our excellent Constitution.
