I am in great Hopes he will also fall in with her Confort, from having difcovered her Orders and Rendezvous.

SIR.

His Majefly's Ship Jafon, at Sea, January 28, 1807.

HAVING received your Orders by His Majefty's Sloop Ofprey, I proceeded towards Maroney River, and Yeflerday Morning at Day-Light, So-ramine River bearing South by East Twenty fix Miles, difcovered a Ship and Brig, nearly Six Miles, on the Weather Beam, apparently Men of War; and from the Information I received a few Days before, conceived them to be the Veffels of which we were in Search; and about a Quarter before Ten, fucceeded in bringing the Ship to Action within Pillol-Shot, who fhortly after ftruck, and proved to be La Favorite, (formerly in His Majelty's Service,) mounting Sixteen long Sixes and Thirteen Twelve-Pounder Carronades, having on board One Hundred and Fifty Men, and com-manded by Monf. Le Marant Daniel, Lieutenant de Vaiffeau. The Brig, from her failing fuperior to the Favorite, and in confequence of Signals from her, kept above Gun-Shot to Windward, and I am forry to fay, from the Time it took to exchange the Priloners, and being favoured by the Wind, the has made her Escape; she mounts Fourteen Brafs Eight-Pounders, (English Nines,) and One Hundred and Twenty Men.

I am happy to add, we had only One Man wounded; the Favorite had One killed and One wounded, and was very much cut up in her Sails and Rigging.

I cannot conclude without returning Thanks to Lieutenant Pringle, First of this Ship, for his active Conduct on this, as well as every Occasion, and am only forry that this Affair did not afford him a greater Opportunity of diltinguishing himfelf.
