T HE following Addreffes having been transmitted to the Right Honourable Lord Hawkefbury, His Majefly's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, have been by his Lordship prefented to the King; which Addreffes His Majefly was pleafed to receive very graciously:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majefty.

May it pleafe your Majefly,

T O permit your Majeity's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Chichefter, to express the grateful Senfe they entertain of your Majetty's truly paternal Confideration for the Welfare of thefe Realms, in difmiffing from your Service Ministers who could prefume to agitate a Queftion which involved and endangered the Safety of our religious Eftablishment, and which had for its Object a Re-

laxation of those wholefome Laws, which have for a Series of Years confined Toleration within just and proper Bounds.

We are at a Lofs which most to admire, the Wifdom which perceived the Neceffity of that Difmiffion, or the Firmness which directed it.

We feel most fensibly that this Act, among many others in your Majesty's aufpicious Reign, manifests your Majesty's high Regard for the Constitution of these Kingdoms both in Church and State; and we fervently pray that Providence may long continue to us your Majesty as its watchful Guardian.

In Testimony whereof we have caufed the Common Seal of the faid City to be hereunto asfixed, this 11th Day of May, in the Fortyfeventh Year of your Majesty's Reign.

The humble Address of the Lord Mayor, Sheriffs, Commons, and Citizens of the City of Dublin, in Common-Council affembled.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majefty's faithful and loyal Subjects, the Lord Mayor, Sheriffs, Commons, and Citizens of the City of Dublin, beg Leave to approach your Throne with Sentiments of the livelieft Gratitude and Affection for your firm and uniform Maintenance of the Conflictution in Church and State.

Whilft we view in our beloved King the pure and amiable Virtues which embellish private Life, we can also trace with peculiar Delight the Magnanimity, Wisdom, and Piety which dignify a public Character, and add Splendour and Renown to the most illustrious and upright of Sovereigns.

Your loyal Citizens of Dublin have alfo perceived with heartfelt Satisfaction that no undue Regard to the Opinions of any Men could ever induce your Majefty to violate the Rights of Confeience, or the Principles of that glorious and matchlefs Confitution, which your Majefty's protecting Virtue will fupport and maintain in its original Purity, and transmit to your Pofterity undiminished and unimpaired.

And we truft that your Majefty's loyal Subjects of every Defeription, fenfible of the Bleffings which they enjoy under a Conftitution which equally protects their Lives, their Liberties, and their Properties, will feel that enthufiaftic Veneration for it which its Merit juftly infpires, and will manifelt their ardent Love to your Majefty, who, confulting the Happinefs and Welfare of your People, wifely determined to maintain it inviolate in all its Parts, well convinced that the Infringement of any might endanger the Safety of the Whole. That your Majelty may long live to enjoy the Affections of your loving and beloved Subjects, is the ardent Prayer of your faithful Citizens of Dublin.
