T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 20th of May 1807,

PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Nineteenth Day of November laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, (except the Mafter General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of June next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majelty's Reign, intituled " An " Act to empower His Majelly to prohibit the " Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the " Law for empowering His Majefty to prohibit ". the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and alfo to empower " His Majelty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of . 44 Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or

" Ammunition :"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.
