BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-VV third Year of the Reign of His prefent Ma-jefty, intituled, "An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be secured in Warehouses without Payment of Duty," it is, amongst other Things, enacted as follows, "That it shall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees of any Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes enumerated or described in the Table hereunto annexed, marked (E), and which shall be legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same in a Warehouse or Warehouses to be provided for that Purpose, any such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of the Duties of Customs

due on the Importation thereof:"
Provided always, "That no Goods, Wares, or Merchandize so enumerated or described in the said Table marked (E), shall be permitted to be fo lodged or fecured, unless and until it shall have been made appear to the Satisfaction of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, that the said Warehouse or Warehouses are complete, fit, and proper in every Respect, for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the same may be fafely and fecurely deposited; and such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize fo lodged and fecured in fuch Warehouses shall, in all other Respects, be liable to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions in this Act contained:"

And whereas, by the Ninth Section of the faid Act, it is further provided and enacted as follows, " That if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables to this Act annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of this Act shall extend and be construed to extend to fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Tables respectively at the Time of passing this Act:"

We, the underfigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to and in execution of the Powers vested in us in and by the said Act, do hereby declare, that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the faid Act should be extended to Snake-Root, legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, or not being imported from the West Indies,) and that such Snake-Root should be added to the List of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the faid recited Act, marked (E); and that such Snake-Root should be lodged and secured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in fuch Warehouse or Warehouses as aforefaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act; and we do hereby give Notice, that from and after the Publication of this our Declaration in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the faid Act, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the faid Act shall extend and be construed to extend to all fuch Snake-Root, in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in Table (E), annexed to the faid Act, at the Time of the passing the same Act.
