fion except One, which drove on Shore and was loft. 1 The Crews of the Enemy's Veffels took to their Boats, but I fear as the Sea ran very high, fome of them were drowned in attempting to land. Had the Breeze fortunately continued, I have no Doubt but we fhould have taken and deftroyed the whole Convoy, which, exclusive of the Gun-Brigs, appears to confift of about Twenty-feven Sail of Brigs, Sloops, and Chaffe Marées. I have the Pleafure to add, that the Officers and Seamen employed on this Service, performed it to my Satisfaction and to their own Credit. Inclosed is a Lift of the Veffels taken and deftroyed, with their Cargoes, &c.
