BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

THEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Fortythird Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled, " An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be fecured in Warehoufes without Payment of Duty," it is, amongft other Things, enacted as follows, "That it fhall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees of any Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes enumerated or defcribed in the Table hereunto annexed, marked (E), and which fhall be legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to lodge and feeure the fame in a Warehoufe or Warehoufes to be provided for that Purpofe, any fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of the Duties of Cultoms due on the Importation thereof :"

Provided always, " That no Goods, Wares, or Merchandize fo enumerated or defcribed in the faid Table marked (E), shall be permitted to be fo lodged or fecured, unlefs and until it shall have been made appear to the Satisfaction of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, that the faid Warehoufe or Warehoufes are complete, fit, and proper in every Re-fpect, for the Reception of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the fame may be fafely and fecurely deposited; and fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize fo lodged and fecured in fuch Warehoufes shall, in all other Respects, be liable to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions in this Act contained :"

And whereas, by the Ninth Section of the faid Act, it is further provided and enacted as follows, " That if the Lord High Treafurer, or the Com-miffioners of His Majefty's Treafury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, fhall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or defcribed in either of the Tables to this Act annexed, and fhall caufe a Lilt of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Reftrictions of this Act shall extend and be construed to extend to fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in the faid Tables respectively at the Time of paffing this Act :"

We, the underfigned Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, purfuant to and in execution of the Powers vefted in us in and by the faid Act, do hereby declare, that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the faid Act should be extended to Snake-Root, legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England

trading to the East Indies, or not being imported from the Weft Indies,) and that fuch Snake-Root fhould be added to the Lift of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and defcribed in the faid Table annexed to the faid recited Act, marked (E); and that fuch Snake-Root fhould be lodged and fecured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in fuch Warehouse or Warehouses as aforefaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act; and we do hereby give Notice, that from and after the Publication of this our Declaration in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the faid Act, all and every the Pro-visions, Regulations, and Reftrictions of the faid Act shall extend and be construed to extend to all fuch Snake-Root, in every Refpect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in Table (E), annexed to the faid Act, at the Time of the paffing the fame Act.
