And whereas, by the Ninth Section of the faid Act, it is further provided and enacted as follows, " That if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commillioners of His Majefty's Treafury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or defcribed in either of the Tables to this Act annexed, and shall caufe a List of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Refrictions of this A& shall extend and be construed to extend to fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, in every Refpect in as full and ample a Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in the faid Tables refpectively at the Time of paffing this Act :"

We, the underfigned Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, purfuant to and in execution of the Powers vefted in us in and by the faid Act, do hereby declare, that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the faid Act should be extended to Snake-Root, legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, or not being imported from the West Indies,) and that fuch Snake-Root should be added to the List of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and defcribed in the faid Table annexed to the faid recited Act, marked (E); and that fuch Snake-Root fhould be lodged and fecured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in fuch Warehoufe or Warehoufes as aforefaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act; and we do hereby give Notice, that from and after the Publication of this our Declaration in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the faid Act, all and every the Provifions, Regulations, and Reftrictions of the faid A& fhall extend and be conftrued to extend to all fuch Snake-Root, in every Refpect in as full and ample a Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in Table (E), annexed to the faid Act, at the Time of the paffing the fame Act.
