The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Sir Edward Pellew, Bart, Commander in Chief of His Ma-jefty's Ships and Vessels in the East Indies, to Wil-liam Marsden, Esq; dated on board His Majesty's Ship Gulloden, Batavia Roads, November 28, 1805.

HEIR Lordships have been already apprized of my Intention of proceeding to this Quarter in Search of the French Squadron, which I had been led to believe would have 'ere this appeared in the Afiatic Seas.

I was joined off the Island of Eugeino, on the 23d Instant, by His Majetty's Ship Sir Francis Drake, and proceeding through the Straits of Sunda with the Ships named in the Margin*, on the 26th, captured off Bantain the Dutch Company's Armed Brig Maria Wilhelmina.

On the following Morning we arrived off Batavia, the Terpfichore leading the Fleet through the very intricate Navigation in a most judicious Manner, preceded by the Sea Flower.

I directed the Frigates and Brig to enter the Roads between the Island of Onrust and Java, the Line of Battle Ships taking a more circuitous Paf-

On discovering us as we approached, the Dutch National Frigate Phœnix, Avanturier and Zee Ploeg Brigs, Two of their Company's Armed Ships, and Two Armed Brigs, immediately run on Shore, followed by the Merchantmen; the William Corvette having previously struck to the Terpsichere on paffing Onruft.

The shoal Water prevented our anchoring sufficiently near to fire with Effect on the Batteries, or
