> WHEREAS by an A&, paffed in the Ninth and Tenth of William the Third, intituled "An A& for the Increase and Preservation of Timber in the New Forest, in the County of Southampton," it was enacted, that Two Thousand Acres, Part of the Waste Lands of the faid New Forest, should be inclosed and kept in Severalty for the Growth and Prefervation of Timber for Supply of His Majelty's Royal Navy, and that it should and might be lawful to and for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, to inclose, sever, and improve, within and out of the Parts or Places of the Waste Lands of the faid New Forest, the full Quantity of Two Thousand Acres, Statute Measure, the same to be set out by virtue of His Majesty's Commission, to be directed to Six or more such Persons as His Majelty should think sit, out of such Parts and Places in the faid Forest as should be found or esteemed by the said Commissioners, or any Three or more of them, to be most convenient to be inclosed, and to be molt apt and meet to produce Wood and Timber for the future Benefit of the Kingdom, and might be best spared from the Com-mons and Highways of the County, to be set out and inclosed, butted, and bounded, &c. in the Manner fet forth in the faid Act; and it was further enacted, that is should be lawful in like Manner to inclose Two Hundred Acres more of the Waste in the faid Forest yearly and every Year, for the Term or Space of Twenty Years, from and after the Time that the Inclosure of the faid Two Thousand Acres above mentioned should be made and completed as aforefaid; and that the faid Inclosures fo fet out and made as aforefaid should remain in Severalty, in the actual Possession of the Crown for ever, freed and discharged of and from all Manner of Right, Title, and Pretence whatfoever, according to the Purport and Intent of the faid Act, and should be called, made, and kept a Nursery for Wood and Timber only; and it was also further eracted and declared, that whenfoever the Lords Commiffioners of the Treasury, Lord Treasurer of England, or Chanceller of the Exchequer, for the Time being, should be fatisfied and should determine that the Woods and Trees which should be growing on the faid I'wo Thousand Acres, or any Part thereof, within the Inclosures which should afterwards be made, were become past Danger of browling of Deer, Cattle, or other Prejudice, and fhould think fit to lay the same, or any Part thereof, open and in common, and should cause the same to be so done, that then and so often it should and might be lawful to and for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, from Time to Time to inclose out of the said Forest, in lieu of so much as should be so laid open of the faid Two Thousand Acres, or of the faid Number of Acres authorized to be inclosed as aforefaid, the like Quantity out of any other Part of the Relidue of the faid Waltes to be fet out and made in like Manner, and by like Commission and Admeasurement as aforesaid, and to be holden, inclosed, freed and discharged of and from all Manner
