PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Conneil.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament, passed in the Forty-fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the more effectual Prevention of Sanuggling," and by another Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to make more effectual Provision for the Prevention of Smuggling;" the Commiffioned Officers of His Majefty's Army, Navy, and Marines, and of the Militia while embodied, and of the Volunteers, or any other of His Majefty's Forces while on Service, and subject to the I'ro visions of any Act in Force for the Punishment of Mutiny and Defertion; and also the Warrant and Non-Commissioned Officers of His Majesty's Army, not being below the Rank of a Serjeant, who faill he approved of by the Officers for the Time being commanding the Regiments in which they respectively ferve, as proper and qualified for the Service, are authorized, empowered, and required to feize all Ships, Vessels, Boats, Horses, Carts, and Carriages, and all prohibited and uncultomed and other Goods liable to Forfeiture and Seizure under any Laws in Force for the Prevention of Smuggling; and certain Rewards are by the faid Acts of Parliament granted for the making of fuch Scizures, and the arrelling of Perfons found employed in Smuggling: And whereas certain Rewards have, under Orders in Council, been allowed and paid to the Officers and Soldiers of His Majefty's Army aiding and affitting the Officers of Cultoms and Exoffe in the making of Scizures of prohibited and uncultomed Goods, and also for the guarding of fuch Seizures to any Warehouse of the Cultoms or Excife: And whereas it will greatly tend to the forwarding of the Purpoles of the faid Acts of Parliament, if other Rewards were chablished and allowed, instead and in lieu of those heretofore allowed and paid under Orders in Council, for fuch aiding, affilting, and guarding as aforefaid: And whereas by the faid latt-mentioned Act of Parliament, His Majetty in Council is empowered to direct and provide in what Manner, and in what Proportion, the faid Rewards for the making of

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 9th Scizures, or aiding any Officer of the Revenue Day of September 1807,

P. R. E. S. E. N. T. Scizures, or aiding any Officer of the Revenue therein, or guarding of any Scizures, shall be divided and distributed amongst the Commissioned, and Warrant, and Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates actually making, or the Privates actually aiding and affilting in the making of the Seizures, and the Commissioned, and Warraut, and Non-Commissioned, and Warraut, and Non-Commissioned fioned Officers and Privates of the Regiment, Battalion, or Corps to which the Persons actually making, or aiding or affilting in, any Seizure shall belong. His Majesty, having taken the same into Consideration, is thereupon graciously pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order and direct, and doth hereby order and direct, and doth hereby order and direct, that the Rewards and Allowances allowed and paid under any former Orders in Council shall be discontinued; and that in future, where any Soldiers shall aid and affilt any Officer or Officers of Customs or Excile in the making of any Seizure of any prohibited or uncustomed Goods, (at which Seizure no Commissioned, or any fuch Warrant or Non-Commissioned Officer as aforefaid, shall be prefent,) there shall be paid the Rewards following; that is to fay,

For all Spirits, of any Kind whatever, calculated and computed at an average Strength of One in Five under Hydrometer Proof, Two Shillings and Sixpence the Gallon.

Tobacco and Snuff, Three Pence the Pound. Wine, Tea, Salt, and other Articles, Twenty-five per Cent. upon the Appraised Value thereof. And for every Horse seized with any such Spirits

or Articles as aforefaid, the Sum of Forty Shil-

And that where any Commissioned, or Warrant, or Non-Commissioned Officers of Privates, shall guard, or assist in guarding, any Seizure which shall have been made by any Officer or Officers of Cuf-toms or Excise, and at which Science no Commis-fioned, or fuch Warrant or Non-Commissioned Officer as oforefaid, fhall be prefent, there shall be paid the Rewards following; that is to fay,

For all Spirits of any Kind whatever, calculated and computed at an Average Strength of One in Five under Hydrometer Proof, One Shilling the Gelion.

Tobacco and Snuff, One Penny Halfpenny the Pound.
