APPLICATION is intended to be made during the next Session of Parliament for Leave to bring in a Bill, for supplying with Water Glasgow, Anderston, and the Places adjacent, lying within the Liberties of the City of Glasgow, and in the Barony Parish of Glasgow, and the Parishes of Govan and Gorbals.
