jefty's Reign, further certify and make known, that the large Warehouse made and erected by the faid Weft India Dock Company under the Authority of the faid Acts of Parliament, at the Weft End of the faid Import Dock, is fo far completed, that, in our Judgment, the fame is fit for the Reception of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize refpectively ; and we do hereby declare our Approbation of the faid last-mentioned Warehoufe accordingly.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF

HIS MAJESTY's TREASURY. HEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Forty-third Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled " An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be fecured in Ware-houfe without Payment of Duty ;" it is (amongh other Things) enacted as follows : "That it fhall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or de-feribed in the Table hereunto annexed marked (A), and which shall be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and fecure the fame under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Mer-chant in any Warehoufe or Warehoufes fituated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of fuch Goods, Wares, and Mer-chandize, of the Duties of Customs or Excife due on the Importation thereof; fubject, neverthelefs, to the Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions directed by this Act : Provided always, that no fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be fo lodged or fecured, unlefs and until fuch Warehoufes and other Works belonging, or to belong thereto, shall be fo far completed, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majetty's Treafury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the fame shall be fit and proper in every Refpect for the Reception of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the fame may refpectively be fafely and fecurely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of this Aci ; and the Lord High Treafurer, or the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, are hereby authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known his or their Approbation of fuch Warehoufes; which Certifi-cate fhall be published Three Times at the least in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newfpapers then ufually circulated in London.

And whereas by a Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commiffioners of His Majelty's Treafury, bearing Date the 16th Day of March 1804, the faid Lords Commiffioners did, in purfu-ance of the faid Act of Parliament, certify and make known that the following Warehoufes, belonging to the West India Dock Company, were fo far completed, that, in their Judgment, the fame were fit and proper in every Refpect for the Reception of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and deferibed in the faid Table awnexed to the faid

Act of Parliament marked (A), and wherein the fame might respectively be fafely and fecurely depofited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act; viz. All those Thirteen Stacks of Warehoufes adjoining each other, and fituate on the North Side of the large Dock belonging to the Weft India Dock Company at the Ifle of Dogs, forming the complete Range of Warehoufes on the North Side of the faid Dock, from the Weft End to the East End thereof; and the faid Lords Commiffioners did thereby declare their Approbation of the faid feveral Warehoufes accordingly.

And whereas by the Ninth Section of the faid Act it is further provided and enacted as follows : "That if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Com-miffioners of His Majefty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or deferibed in either of the Tables to this Act annexed, and fhall caufe a Lift of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Reftrictions of this A& fhall extend, and be construed to extend, to fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every Respect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in the faid Tables refpectively at the Time of paffing this Act."

And whereas by another Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, bearing Date the 26th Day of March 1805, the faid Lords Commiffioners, purfuant and in Execution of the Powers vefted in them in and by the faid Act, did thereby declare that it appeared to them to be expedient that the Provisions of the faid A& fhould be extended to Wines imported in Ships arriving from the Weft Indies, (cxcepted in Table (B), annexed to the faid Act); and that all Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, whether the fame should have been thipped on board fuch Veffels in the Weft Indies. or elfewhere, might refpectively be fafely and fecurely deposited in all or any of the Thirteen Stacks of Warehoufes, hereinbefore deferibed, and remain therein under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act ; and the faid Lords Commiffioners did further declare, that from and after the Publication of their Certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the faid Act, all and every the Provifions, Regulations, and Reftrictions of the faid Act fhould extend, and be confirued to extend, to all fuch Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in Table (A) annexed to the faid Act at the Time of paffing the fame Act :

And whereas by another Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treafury, bearing Date the 5th Day of July 1805, the faid Lords Commiffioners did, in purfuance of the faid Act of Parliament, further certify and make known, that the following Ware-houfes, belonging to the Welt India Dock Com-pany, were fo far completed, that, in their Judg-ment, the fame were alfo fit and proper in every Refpect for the Reception of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and defcribed in the
