The King has been pleased to grant unto Edward Gillyatt Marris, Son of George Marris, of Kirmond, in the County of Lincoln, Esq; and of Anne his Wife, His Royal Licence and Authority that he may take and use the Surname of Gillyatt, in compliance with the last Will and Testament of his Godfather Edward Gillyatt, late of the Bank of England, Esq; deceased, provided that His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise his said Licence and Permission to be void and of none Effect.

THE Principal Officers of His Majesty's Ordnance do hereby give Notice, that Proposals will be received at their Office in Pall-Mall, on or before Wednesday the 17th of November next, from such Persons as may be willing to undertake the Supply of the under-mentioned Quantities and Description of Timber and Materials required for Service of this Department at Woolwich, viz.

400 Loads of hewed Oak Timber, from 70 to 80 Feet meeting.

80,000 Oak Spokes, chopped.

1000 Loads of Elm Timber, hewed.

3000 Elm Stocks, chopped and bored, 15 × 15 Inches; and

4000 Ditto, 14 × 14 Inches.

600 Loads of Ash Timber, round, from 30 to 60 Feet meeting

300 Loads of 4 Inch Ash Plank.

20,000 Ash Fellies, 4 × 4 Inches

400 Ash Axletree Beds, 4 Feet 8 × 7 Inches.

6000 1½ Inches Feet superficial of seasoned Elm Board; and

30,000 ½ Inch ditto of ditto.

The Whole of the Articles to be delivered at Woolwich, at the Expence of the Contractor, in the following Proportions, and on or before the Periods hereafter specified, viz.

31st March 1808—300 Loads of the Elm Timber, and 200 Loads of the Ash Timber;

30th April—400 Loads of the Elm Timber, One Half of the Elm Stocks, 200 Load of the Ash Timber, 150 Load of the Ash Plank, 10,000 Ash Fellies, and the whole of the Axletree Beds;

30th June—200 Loads of the Oak Timber, 30,000 Oak Spokes, 300 Loads of the Elm Timber, the remaining Half of the Elm Stocks, 200 Loads of the Ash Timber, 150 Loads of the Ash Plank, and 10,000 Ash Fellies;

30th September—200 Loads of the Oak Timber, and 50,000 of the Oak Spokes;

And, on or before the 24th of December 1808, the whole of the Elm Board.

Proposals may be offered jointly or separately for each Article; but no Tender can be received for the Timber and Plank for less than 30 Loads each; for the Oak Spokes for less than 1000; for Elm Stocks for less than 400 of either Dimension; for Ash Fellies for less than 1000; for Ash Axletree Beds for less than 100; and for the Elm Board of 1½ Inch for less than 3000 superficial Feet; and for that of ½ Inch for less than 6000 superficial Feet; neither will any Stick of Elm Timber be received under 60 Feet.
