'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twentieth Day of May laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of December next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of December next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaltwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An " Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the 46 Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the 44 Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit 44 the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of

46 Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twenty-fecond Day of December One thousand eight hundred and ix, for the Payment of Bounties for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy; and the Rewards for discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, so that such Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service; and also the Rewards to Persons who should procure the voluntary Service of Able and Ordinary Seamen and Landmen, fit for His Majesty's Naval Service, and should convey such Seamen and Landmen on board any of His Majesty's Ships and Veffels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, will expire on the Thirty-first Day of December next; which Bounties and Rewards are as follows; that is to fay, To every Able Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should enter himself to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, a Bounty of Five Pounds; and to every Ordinary Seaman fo entering himfelf, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, a Bounty of Two Pounds Ten Shillings; to every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, fo entering himself, a Bounty of Thirty Shillings; to any Person or Persons who shall discover any Able or Ordinary Seaman or Seamen, who may have concealed him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Officers employed to raise Men, a Reward of Three Pounds for every such

Able Seaman, and Fifty Shillings for every fuch Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships; to any Perfon or Perfons who shall procure the voluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen, fit for His Majesty's Service, and shall convey them on board any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in railing Men, a Reward of Three Guineas for every fuch Able Seaman, Two Guineas for every fuch Ordinary Seaman, and One Guinea for every fuch Landman, together with an Allowance at the Rate of One Penny per Mile for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile fuch Men may respectively travel to the nearest of His Majesty's Ships of War, or nearest Place of Residence of any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men; provided such Man shall be found sit for His Majesty's Service, and there shall not be Reason to suppose that he is an Apprentice: And whereas it is expedient that the faid feveral Bounties, Rewards, and travelling Allowance should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards, and travelling Allowance be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of December next to the Thirty-first Day of Decembet One thousand eight hundred and eight, inclusive, and that the same be paid in the Manner fpecified in His Majesty's several Proclamations now in force, for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and for the discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, and for giving Rewards for procuring the voluntary Service of Seamen and Landmen; whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly. WHEREAS in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by an Act, passed in the Fortyfixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for reviving and continuing feveral Laws of Cuftoms relating to the establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain of Corn; and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provifion without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and nine; and for continuing several Laws relating to the granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported from Great Britain, and taking off the Duties on Importation into Great Britain of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax; to the granting a Bounty upon the Importa-tion into Great Britain of Hemp, and rough and undressed Flax, from His Majesty's Colonies in America; and to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the regulating the Prices at which Corn and Grain may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to

Great Britain; and to the Admission to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and Blubber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majesty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery from, and residing in, the said Island; and for continuing an Act of the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the permitting the Impor-tation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn and Potatoes, or other Provisions; and to the permitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Fish, and Provisions without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight; and for reviving and continuing an Act, passed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twentyfifth Year of His present Majesty, for the Encouragement of the Flaxen and Hemp Manufactures of Ireland, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven; and for amending and further continuing an A&, made in the Seventh Year of His present Majesty, for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and nine:" It was, amongst other Things, enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships; which, by an Act made in the Forty-fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and fix, and extended to Goat Skins imported in Foreign Ships, should be, and the same was thereby revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight: And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirteenth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and seven, to permit, for the Space of Six Months, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat Skins dreffed or undreffed, on the Duties specified in the faid Order: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Permission should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, from the Twenty-sixth Day of this instant November, until the Twenty fifth Day of March next, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat Skins, dreffed or undreffed, in any Foreign Ship or Veffel; and that, on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel, with any of the Articles above-mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of the Cuftoms and Excife as are due and payable on the like

Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built 1 Ship or Veffel .- And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

DESIRE you will be pleafed to lay before their Lordships the inclosed Copy of a Letter, which I received this Day from Captain Vansittart, of the Fortunée, giving an Account of the Capture by that Ship of Le Magicien French Lugger Priva-teer, pierced for Fourteen Guns, (but having only Two on board) with Forty-four Men.
