A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Seventeenth Day of December next, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Seventeenth Day of December next to Thursday the Twenty-first Day of January next; and We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the Advice aforesaid, declare Our Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Twenty-first Day of January next, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Twenty-first Day of January next.

Given at Our Court at the Queen's Palace, the Twenty-fifth Day of November, One thousand eight hundred and seven, in the Forty-eighth Year of Our Reign.

I enclose a Letter from Captain Palmer, reporting to me, that he had, on the 14th Instant, captured the Friedland, French Luggier Privateer, of Eighteen Guns, and Forty two Men; which I beg you will be pleased to lay before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

SIR, December 14, 1807.

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that on the 14th Instant, at Six P. M. His Majesty's Sloop Alacrity, under my Command, came up with and captured, after a Chace of Two Hours, the French Privateer Luggier Friedland, of Dunkirk, commanded by Francis Louis Beens, being quite a new Vessel, on her second Cruise, mounting Eighteen Guns, and Forty two Men, out Two Days, having made One Capture, a Swedish Galliot, from Stock-

holm, bound to Plymouth, laden with Tar and Iron.

There is One Man killed on board the Privateer.
