/ HEREAS Our Parliament flands prorogated to Thursday the Seventeenth Day of December next, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Seventeenth Day of December next to Thursday the Twenty-first Day of January next; and We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our · United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the Advice afore-faid, declare Our Will and Pleasure, that the faid Parliament shall, on the faid Twenty-first Day of January next, be held and fit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Wellminster on the faid Twenty-first. Day of January next,
