The King has been gracioully pleafed, by an efpecial Warrant under His Royal Signet and Sign Manual, to grant unto Sir Charles Brifbane, Knight, a Captuin in the Royal Navy, and Senior Officer of the Squadron of His Majefty's Ships to which the Island of Curaçao and its Dependencies furrendered, on the 1st Day of January last, His Royal Licence and Authority that, in confideration of his meritoriou: Conduct on that Occasion, he may bear to the Armorial Enfigns used by his Family, the honous c'e Augmentation following, that is to fay, " 2 Chief, embattled thereon a Ship of War under Sail between Two Galles; and for Greft, out of a Naval Crown, an Arm embound grafping a Sword, and from the Hand a Michael fuffended by a Ribbon; Motto "CUMAÇAO;" the faid Arms, Creft, and Motto, to be borne by him the faid Sir Charles Brifbane and his Defcendants; and although the Privilege of bearing Supporters be limited to the Peers of the Realm, the Knights of His Majefty's Orders, and the Proxies of the Blood Royal at Installations, except in fuch Cafes wherein under particular Circumstances His Majesty has been pleased to grant His especial Licence for the Use thereof; yet, in order to give a further Teftimony of His particular Approbation of the diffinguished Services of the faid Sir Charles Brisbane, His Majesty has been gracioully pleafed to allow him to bear, for Supporters to his Arms - " On the dexter Side a Britifh Sailor, and on the Sinifler a Britifb Marine;" pro-vided the fame be first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Herald's-Office, otherwife His Majefty's faid Licence and Permillion to be void and of none Effect :

And alfo to order, that this His Majefty's Conceffion and efpecial Mark of His Royal Favour be regiltered in His College of Arms.
