SALTASH RIGHT OF ELECTION PE-TITION.

Veneris, 22° Die Januarij, 1808.

JAMES BULLER, Esq; Arthur Champernowne,
Esq: Matthew Russell, Esq; the Reverend John Buller, Clerk, John Evans, Gent. John Stephens Croft, and Isaac Toby, having this Day presented their Petition to the House of Commons, setting forth; That at the Election of Burgeffes to ferve in Parliament for the Borough of Saltash, in the County of Cornwall, held on or about the 5th Day of November 1806, the Petitioners, Arthur Champernowne and Matthew Russell, and also the Ho-nourable Richard Neville and Villiam Henry Freemantle, Esq; were Candidates to represent the said Borough in Parliament; and that the Mayor of the Laid Borough, who acted as Returning Officer, con-

Matthew Rullell, to have a confiderable Majority of legal Voters at such Election, returned the Petitioners, Arthur Champe nowne and Matthew Ruffell, as duly elected to serve in Parliament as Burgesses for the said Borough of Saltash; against which Return Two Petitions were presented to the House; one by and on the Behalf of the said Richard Neville and William Henry Freemantle, and the other by and on the Behalf of Nicholas Vincent, an Admiral in His Majesty's Navy; John Scott, Esq; the Reverend Robert Hughes, Clerk, Ed-mund Herring, John Smith, and Edmund Nepean, Gentlemen, stating, among other Things, that the said Richard Neville and William Henry Freemantle were duly elected, and ought to have been returned as Burgesles to serve in Parliament for the said Borough of Saltash, and praying such Relief as to the House should seem meet; and that on Wednesday the 28th Day of January last, a Select Committee of the House was appointed to try the Merits of the said Petitions; and that the said Committee, on the Hearing of the faid Petitions, required the Counfel for the several Parties to deliver to the Clerk of the said Committe, Statements, in Writing, of the feveral Rights of Election for which they respectively contended; and that in consequence thereof, the Counsel for the Petitioners, the faid Richard Neville and William Henry Freemantle, and also for the faid several other Petitioners, delivered in a State-ment as follows: " That the Right of voting for " Members to serve in Parliament for the Borough " of Saltash is in the Mayor and Free Burgesses of "the Borough of Saltash, being Members of the "Corporation within the same;" and that the Counsel for the faid Sitting Members, Matthew Russell and Arthur Champernowne, delivered in a Statement as follows: " That the Right of Election " of Members to serve in Parliament for the Borough " of Saltash, in the County of Cornwall, is in every Person seised of an Estate for Life, or some greater Estate, in an entire Aucient Burgage Tenement fituate within the Borough aforefaid, " whereon an Ancient Dwelling house now stands, " or formerly stood, and in no other Persons;" and that upon the Statement delivered in by the Counfel for the then Sitting Members, the faid Committee determined, that the Right of Election as let forth in the faid Statement, is not the Right of Election for the faid Borough of Saltash; and that upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the said several Petitioners, the said Committee determined that the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is the Right of Election for the said Borough, so far as the said Right is therein described; and that the said Committee having confidered the faid Statements and Evidence adduced before them, touching the Right of Election for the faid Borough of Saltash, did determine, " That the Right of voting for Mem-" bers to serve in Parliament for the Borough of " Saltash, is in the Mayor and Free Burgesses of " the Borough of Saltain, being Members or the " Corporation within the fame, and in no other " Persons;" and that the Petitioners are not satisfied with the faid Resolutions and Determinations of the said Select Committee, and are advised that the same are contrary to Law, and are delirous of being admitted Parties to oppose the said Right ceiving the Petitioners, Atthur Champernowne and of Election, deemed valid in the Judgment of the
