

Whitehall, January 30, 1808.

Whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty, that, on the Night of the 20th Ultimo, William Blackett, (a Watchman stationed at one of His Majesty's Warehouses for seized Spirits, at the Town of Deal, in the County of Kent,) was violently assaulted and dangerously wounded by Five or Six Persons unknown, who were lurking about the said Warehouse, with Intent to plunder the same, and one or more of whom struck the said William Blackett about the Head with an Iron Crow, or some such Weapon, and several Times knocked him down;

His Majesty is most graciously pleased, for discovering the said Offenders, hereby to offer His most gracious Pardon to any one of the said Offenders (except the Person or Persons who so struck the said William Blackett with an Iron Crow,) who will give Information against any one or more of the said Offenders, so that he or they may be convicted of the said Offence.

ARMY CONTRACTS.

Commissary-General's-Office, Great George-Street, January 28, 1808.

NOTICE is hereby given to all Persons desirous of contracting to supply the following Articles for the Use of the Army, viz.

BREAD, to His Majesty's Land Forces in Cantonments, Quarters, and Barracks, in the Counties of Essex and Devon, and the Scilly Islands.

OATS, to His Majesty's Cavalry in Cantonments and Quarters, in the Counties of Dorset and Norfolk.

FORAGE, viz. Oats, Hay, and Straw, to His Majesty's Cavalry in Barracks in the Counties of Northampton, Somerset, and York:

As also Forage to all Horses kept for His Majesty's Service in the Islands of Guernsey and Alderney.

That the Deliveries are to commence on and for the 25th Day of March next; that Proposals in Writing, sealed up and marked, Tender for Army Supplies, will be received at this Office, on or before the 18th Day of February, (but none will be received after Eleven o'Clock on that Day,) and, if sent by Post, the Postage must be paid.

Proposals must be made separately for each County and Island, except for the Island of Guernsey, which must include Alderney, and each Proposal must be accompanied by a Letter from Two respectable Persons engaging to become bound with the Person tendering, in the Sum of 1000l. for the due Performance of the Contract; and no Proposal will be noticed, unless made on, or annexed to, a printed Tender, and the Prices expressed in Words at Length; nor unless the Party, or an Agent for him, personally attend on the following Day, to know the Decision thereon; and should it so happen that during the Continuance of the Contract, no Troops should be stationed or supplied in the County, the Expenses of the Contract and Bond paid in the first Instance by the Contractor, to be refunded to him by the Commissary-General.
