*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, the Noblemen, Gentlemen, Freeholders, and other Inhabitants of the County of Banff, beg Leave to approach your Royal Presence, actuated by the purest Principles of Loyalty and Patriotism.

At this awful Conjunction we are solicitous to renew our Assurances of unshaken Attachment to your Majesty's Person, Family, and Government; and to express in this public Manner our firm Resolution of maintaining to the utmost of our Power the Honour and Dignity of your Majesty's Crown, and the true Interests of the United Kingdom.

While we contemplate, with unfeigned Concern, the Nations around us crouching before an ambitious and powerful Conqueror, we felicitate ourselves as Inhabitants of a more favoured Land, which has hitherto been enabled to withstand the fiercest Rage of the Enemy, which has Courage to resist his Encroachments, and Power to check the Progress of his Devastations.

We are not insensible of the Dangers which surround us, nor indifferent to the vast Resources of a persevering Foe; but these serve only to confirm us in Attachment to that unrivalled Constitution, of which he would attempt to deprive us.

Firm in the inspiring Confidence of a good Cause, and humbly relying on the Protection of the Supreme Ruler, we pledge ourselves not to relax our strenuous Exertions for the Preservation of that precious Inheritance which we derive from our Ancestors, neither murmuring at the Sacrifices we may be called upon to make, nor shrinking from the Difficulties we may encounter in the arduous Contest.

That your Majesty may long continue to reign on the Throne of this Kingdom, and in the Hearts of a faithful and united People, is the most fervent Wish and Prayer of your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects of the County of Banff.

The humble Address of the Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the Borough of Ayr.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, your Majesty's most faithful and loyal Subjects, the Provost, Magistrates, and Council of your ancient Borough of Ayr, in Council assembled, contemplating the hostile Combination now formed against the Independence of our Country, feel ourselves called upon to renew to your Majesty the Assurances of our most sincere Attachment to your Majesty's Person and to our invaluable Constitution.

The sole Object of the Contest in which we are engaged being, as your Majesty has been pleased to declare, the Attainment of a secure and honourable Peace, we firmly trust that the Attainment of this Object in any Manner incompatible with the Dignity of your Majesty's Crown, or the just Rights and Interests of your People, will never be recorded in the Annals of the British Empire. Feeling, in common with our Fellow-Subjects, the Pressure of those Inconveniencies, naturally arising from a Contest of such Magnitude, we beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that we regard these as of trivial Moment when compared to the important Interests a Sovereign and a Country, so dear to us, have at Stake. In asserting your Majesty's just Claims we shall deem no Sacrifice too great; and we look forward with the fullest Confidence to the Wisdom of your Majesty's Councils, to the continued Exertions of your Majesty's Arms, and to the Efforts of a loyal and united People, for the Accomplishment of your Majesty's paternal Wish, the Restoration of the Blessing of Peace consistent with Safety and with Honour.

We pray Heaven that your Majesty may long reign over an Empire which has ever been, and which, we trust, will ever remain gloriously independent among the Nations of the World.

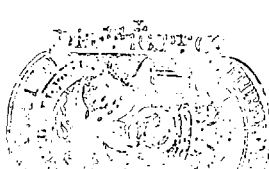

THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein*



named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly; and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for continuing to His Majesty certain Duties on Malt, Sugar, Tobacco, and Snuff, in Great Britain, and on Pensions and Offices in England, and for repealing so much of certain Acts as relate to certain Duties of Sixpence and One Shilling respectively on Offices and Pensions, and for re-granting the said Duties of Sixpence and One Shilling respectively, and the said other Duties for the Service of the Year 1808.

An Act for empowering the Governor and Company of the Bank of England to advance the Sum of Three Millions towards the Supply for the Service of the Year 1808.

An Act to authorize the advancing for the Public Service upon certain Conditions a Proportion of the Balance remaining in the Bank of England for Payment of unclaimed Dividends, Annuities, and Lottery Prizes, and for regulating the Allowances to be paid for the Management of the National Debt.

An Act for regulating the issuing and paying off of Exchequer Bills.

An Act to continue until the End of this Session of Parliament, several Acts for carrying into Execution the Treaty of Amity, Commerce, and Navigation, between His Majesty and the United States of America.

An Act for repealing an Act made in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for suspending the Operation of an Act of the Thirty-sixth Year of His present Majesty for the further Support and Maintenance of Curates within the Church of England, and for other Purposes in the said Act mentioned, so far as relates to the Avoidance of Benefices by the Incumbents thereof, having accepted augmented Curacies."

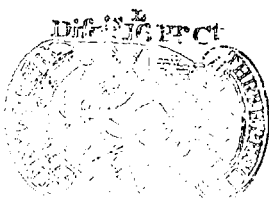
