HEREAS in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by an Act, passed in the Fortyfixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for reviving and continuing several Laws of Customs relating to the establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and nine; and for continuing several Laws relating to the granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Iria Lineus exported from Great Britain, and taking off the Duties on Importation into Great Britain of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax; to the granting a Bounty upon the Importation into Great Britain of Hemp, and rough and undressed Flax, from His Majesty's Colonies in America, and to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fishe ries; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the regulating the Prices at which Corn and Grain may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to Great Britain; and to the Admission to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and Blubber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majesty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery from, and residing in, the said Island; and for continuing an A.C. of the Twenty third Year of His present Majesty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or other Provisions, and to the permitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Fish, and Provisions, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight; and for reviving and continuing an Act, passed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for the Encouragement of the Flaxen and Hempen

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 6th , Manufactures of Ireland until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and twentyfeven; and for amending and further continuing an Act made in the Seventh Year of His present Majesty for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine:"

His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, hearing Date the Thirtieth Day of September last, to permit for the Space of Six Months, from the Sixteenth Day of October then next, the Importation of fundry Articles of Provisions, therein specified, Duty free: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Sixteenth Day of Months, to commence from the Sixteenth Day of this inflant April, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulfe; and alfo of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be imported with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in an Ast passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commillianers of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necellary Directions herein accordingly. An Act to prohibit, until the End of the next Session of Parliament, the Exportation of Cotton

Wool from Great Britain.

An Act for further continuing, until the 24th Day of June 1809, an Act of the Forty-fixth Year of His present Majesty, for altering and amending feveral Laws relating to the Duties of Excise upon Malt.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

AT a Period unexampled in the Annals of this Country, we, your Majesty's loyal and dutiful Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Chief Citizens of the City of Bath, in Common Council affembled, deem it our indispensable Duty to come forward and repeat our Declarations of unshaken Fidelity and Attachment to your Majesty's sacred Person and Government.

Contemplating with deep Concern the Misery and Distress which restless Ambition has brought upon almost all the States of the European Continent, we acknowlege with Gratitude the interpoling Providence that has preferved this Nation from limitar Calamities, and continued to us, under your Majesty's mild and equitable Sway, the Blessings of

May the same over-ruling Power continue to inspire your Majesty's Councils with Wisdom and Vigour commensurate to the arduous Contest in which we are engaged; may Zeal and Unanimity influence the Hearts of all your Subjects in Support of your Majesty's just and equitable Government; and may your Majesty be enabled by the Divine Bleffing upon your Arms, by Sea and Land, effectually to refult the powerful and extended Confederacy directed against your Majesty's Dominions; and ultimately to accomplish your Majesty's earnest Defire, to obtain for your People an honourable, fecure, and permanent Peace.

Now I do hereby, and by virtue of an A& passed in the Forty-second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An "A&t for regulating the 'Frial of Controverted "Elections or Returns of Members to serve in the "United Parliament for Ireland;" direct the aforestaid Select Committee to re-assemble and meet again upon Tuesday the 3d Day of May next, at Eleven of the Clock in the Forenoon, to take the Proceedings of the said Commissioners into Consideration; for which this shall be to the aforesaid Select Committee a sufficient Warrant.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be secured in Ware-house without Payment of Duty;" it is enacted, "That it hall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Configuee or Configures, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or deferfied in the Table thereunto annexed marked (A), and which shall be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and focure the fame under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant in any Warehouse or Warehouses situated at the life of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Customs or Excise due on the Importation thereof; fubject, nevertheless, to the Rules, Regulations, and Reltrictions directed by this Act: Provided always, that no fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be so lodged or secured, unless and until such Warehouses and other Works belonging, or to belong thereto, shall be so far completed, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commisdioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the same shall be fit and proper in every Respect for the Reception of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the fame may respectively be safely and securely depolited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of this Act; and the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, are authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known this or their Approbation of such Warehouses; which risticate shall be published Three Times at the least in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers then usually circulated in London."

"Provided always, and it is further enacted, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables to this Act annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of this Act shall extend, and be construct to extend, to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every Respect, in as sull and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Tables respectively at the Time of passing this Act."

We, the underligned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to and in execution of the Powers vefted in us in and by the faid Act, do hereby declare that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Angustura Bark legally imported or brought into the Port of London from the West Indies, and that such Angustura Bark should be added to the List of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the faid recited Act marked (A); and that fuch Angustura Bark should be lodged and secured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in such Warehouse or Warehouses as aforcfaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act; and we do further declare, that from and . after the Publication of this our Certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the faid Act, all and every the Provisions, Regula-... tions, and Restrictions of the said Act shall extend, 15 and be confirmed to extend, to all such Angusture Bark, in every respect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in Table (A) annexed to the said A& at the Time of the passing the same Act.
