BOROUGH OF GRAMPOUND RIGHT OF ELECTION.

WHEREAS the Select Committee appointed to try and determine the Merits of the Petition of the Honourable George Augustus Frederick Cochrane and William Holmes, Esq; and also of the Petition of John Croggon, Tanner, Francis Brown, Isaac Watts, William Croggon, and Thomas Courtis, Voters, and claiming a Right to vote at the Election of Members of Parliament for the Borough of Grampond, in the County of Cornwall, have this Day reported to the House of Commons,

That it appeared to the said Committee that the Merits of the Petitions did depend upon the Right of Election; and that therefore the said Committee required the Counsel for the several Parties to deliver to the Clerk of the said Committee Statements in Writing of the Right of Election for which they respectively contended:

That, in consequence thereof, the Counsel for the Petitioners, the Honourable George Augustus Frederick Cochrane and William Holmes, Esq; delivered in a Statement as follows:

“ That the Right of voting for Members to serve in Parliament for the Borough of Grampond is “ in the Mayor and Burgesses of Grampond:”

That the Counsel for the Sitting Members, Robert Williams, jun. and John Teed, Esqrs. delivered in a Statement as follows:

“ That the Right of Election of Members to serve in Parliament for the Borough of Grampond, is in the Mayor, Capital Burgesses, and “ Freemen, or Free Burgesses of the same, resident “ within the Borough:”
