**WE**, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in Great Britain, do hereby declare, in pursuance of an Act of the Forty seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to allow for Two Years from and after the passing of this Act, an additional Bounty on Double Refined Sugar; and to extend former Bounties on other Refined Sugar to such as shall be pounded, crashed or broken; and to allow, for One Year, certain Bounties on British Plantation Raw Sugar exported;" that the Regulations of the said Act contained, relating to the Allowance of the Bounties on Lump or Loaf Sugar pounded, crashed, or broken, or on Sugar Candy, in pursuance thereof, shall be extended to the Port of Hull—Whitehall, Treasury Chambers, May 25, 1808.

TO OFFICERS OF ROYAL MARINES ON HALF-PAY.

**ALL** Officers on the Half-Pay of the Royal Marines resident in Great Britain and Ireland, are hereby required to transmit to the Secretary of the Admiralty, within One Month from the Date hereof, an Account in Writing of their Age, past Services, and present Place of Abode; and such as think themselves from Age or Infirmities unfit for further Service, are to accompany their Reports with sufficient Vouchers of their Inability, and the Causes thereof. The Officers resident Abroad are to make their Reports in Six Months, those in the East Indies excepted, who are allowed Twelve Months.

Should any of the said Officers neglect to pay due Attention to this public Notice, within the respective Periods above limited, they will be considered as otherwise provided for, or dead, and their Names will be struck off the Half-Pay List accordingly.

**WHEREAS** it has been humbly represented to the King, that between the Hours of Ten and Eleven o'Clock on the Night of Thursday the 14th of April, some wicked Person or Persons did feloniously and maliciously set on Fire the Wood of His Majesty in the Inclosure called Ocknell, in the New Forest, in the County of Southampton; and several of the other Inclosures in the said Forest having of late been set on Fire in like Manner, whereby Damage has been done to the young Timber growing thereon:

And whereas it is enacted by the Act of the 1 Geo. 1.

Stat. 2. cap. 48, "That if any Person shall maliciously set on Fire, or burn, or cause to be burned, any Wood, Underwood, Coppice, or any Part thereof, he shall be guilty of Felony;"

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the said Felonies, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Person or Persons (except the Person or Persons who actually set the said Inclosures on Fire) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
