WE, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in Great Britain, do hereby declare, in pursuance of an Act of the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to allow for Two Years from and after the passing of this Act, an additional Bounty on Double Refined Sugar, and to extend former Bounties on other Refined Sugar to such as shall be pounded, crushed, or broken; and to allow for One Year certain Bounties on "British Plantation Raw Sugar exported;" that the Regulations of the said Act contained, relating to the Allowance of the Bounties on Lump or Loaf Sugar pounded, crushed, or broken, or on Sugar Candy, in pursuance thereof, shall be extended to the Port of Newcastle.—Whitchall, Treasury Chambers, the 14th Day of June 1808.
