Then a Commillion for proroguing the Parliament was read. After which the Lord Chancellor faid :

My Lords, and Gentlemen, *

BY wirtue of His Majesty's Commission under the Great Seal, to us and other Lords directed, and now read, we do in His Majefly's Name, and in Obedience to His Commands, prorogue this Parliament to Saturday she Twentieth Day of August next, to be then here holden; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogued to Saturday the Twentieth Day of August next.
