And while we hambly offer up our hearty Prayers to Almighty God that, after fo many Years of his juit Chaitisement, he would be pleased to unnerve the Arm of the Oppressor, to bles the Cause of that Being whom he has flamped with his own immortal Image, and to give Repofe to the wearied Nations, permit us, Sire, to express our deep Senfe of the paternal Solicitude with which your Majefty, through a long Reign in new and difaftrous Times, has preferved to us unimpaired a Conflication, fo uniform and equal in its Bleffings, that, like the Sun in its Courle, it neglects not to thine upon the poor Man's Glebe, and to warm and cherifh the lowly Cottager.
