Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir John Borlafe Warren, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Ma-jesty's Ships and Veffels at Halifax, to the Honour-able IV. W. Pole, dated at Halifax, July 14, 1808. SIR,

BE pleafed to communicate the inclosed Copy of a Letter I have received from Captain Austen, acquainting me that His Majesty's Sloop Indian under his Command had captured La Jeune Eftelle French Privateer, of Four Guns and Twentyfive Men, from the River St. Mary's, bound to St. Domingo with a Cargo of Flour and Provisions; another was in Company, but escaped.

His Majefly's Sloop Indian, June 27, 1808.

I HAVE the Honour to inform you, that at Daylight on the 19th Inftant, being in Latitude 28° 34' N. Longitude 74° 4' W. I fell in with Two Schooners, which initantly made fail from us on different Tacks; I chaced the one which appeared largest, and fent the Boats in pursuit of the other. After a short Chace I captured La Jeune Eftelle French Privateer, of Four Guns and Twenty-five Men; from the River St. Mary's to St. Domingo with a Cargo of Flour and Provisions. I am forry to add that, in confequence of a Breeze foringing up when within half Gun fhot, the Boats were not able to come up with the other, which i learn from the Priloners was L'Exchange, of Six Guns and Ninety-five Men, partly loaded with Provisions, and bound also to Sr. Domingo.

La Jeune Estelle had One Man killed and One wounded by our Chace Guns. . From the Nature of her Cargo I have thought it advisable to take her to Bermuda, which I hope will meet with your Approbation.
