We trust that the Exertions of Spain and Portugal, aided by those of Britain, may, under the Bleffing of Divine Providence, be the Means of re-eltablishing the Liberties and the Peace of Europe.

We continue to exert ourfelves in inftilling the Principles of Virtue and Religion into the Minds of the rifing Generation committed to our Care; and, along with uleful Knowledge, in pointing out to them the Bleffings they enjoy under our happy and envied Conflicution; and we beg to return our most fincere Thanks for your Majelly's late seafonable Bounty to this Univerfity.

That your Majefty's most valuable Life may be long preferved as a Bleffing to these Kingdoms; that you may long continue the Guardian and Protector of Learning; and that you may prove the Reftorer of the Liberties of Europe, are the fincere and fervent Prayers of, molt gracious Sovereign, your Majesty's most faithful and loyal Subjects,

TRANSMIT herewith the Copy of a Letter which I this Day received from Captain Upton, of His Majelty's Ship Sybille, dated at Sea the 16th ult. stating the Capture of the French Brig Cor-vette L'Espiegle, of Sixteen Guns and Eighty-five Men, which I request you will be pleafed to lay before the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and acquaint their Lordihips that L'Espiegle arrived Yefterday Evening.

I HAVE the Satisfaction of announcing to you the Capture of the French Brig Corvette Espiegle, of Sixteen Guns and Eighty-five Men, commanded by Monfieur Maujouan, Capitaine de Fregate, Six Days from L'Orient, with lecret Orders. La Di-ligente, a Ship Corvette of Eighteen Guns, effected her Efcape from the Sybille by feparating from the Efpiegle at the Clofe of Day.
