THE Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having given Directions for paying off the Principal of the above-mentioned Exchequer Bills with the Interest thereon; at the Exchequer Bill-Office, in the Receipt of Exchequer, New Palace-Yard, Westminster, on Saturday the 22d Day of October 1808, Attendance will be given daily (Sundays and Holidays excepted) until Tuesday the 11th Day of October 1808 inclusive, from Ten o'Clock in the Morning till One in the Afternoon, for the Purpose of receiving the same.
