7 HEREAS in virtue of the Powers velted in His Majetty by an Act, passed in the. Fortyfixth Year of His Majefly's Reign, Cap 20, inti-tuled "An Act for reviving and continuing fe-veral Laws of Customs relating to the establishing. Courts of Judicature in the Alland of Newfoundand; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, , and permitting the Importation to, "Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Providing without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-tifth Day of March, One thoufand eight hundred and nine; and for continuing s feveral Laws relating to the granting a Bounty, supon certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported from Great. Britain, and taking off the , Duties on Importation into Great Britain of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax ; to the grant ing a Bouncy upon the Importation into Great Britain of Hemp, and rough and undreffed Flax, strom "His Majelty's Colonies in America, and to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries ; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the regulating the Prices at which Corn and Grain may be exported from Great Britain to Iteland, and from Ireland to Great Britain ; and to the Admiffion to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and , Blubber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majefty's Subjects carrying on the Filtiery from, and seliding in, the faid Hand, and for continuing an Act of the Twenty third Year of His prefent Majelty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain ; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships ; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Com or Potatoes, or other Provisions, and to the permitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Fifti, and Provisions, without Payment of Duty, un-til the Twenty fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight ; and for reviving and continuing an Act, passed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twenty-fifth Year of His prefent Majefty,

for the Eucouragement of the Flaxen and Hempes Manufactures of Ireland until the Twenty-fifth Day of Match One thousand eight hundred and twentyfeven; and for amending and further continuing an Act made in the Seventh Year of His prefent Majefty for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine:"

His Majelly was pleafed by His Order in Council, hearing Date the Sixth Day of April laft, to permit, for the Space of Six Months, from the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of April, the Importation of funday Articles of Provilions, therein fpecified, Duty free: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majetty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to allow, and doth hereby allow, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thouland eight hundred and nine, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulfe; and allo of Bulls, Cows, Oxen; Calves, Sheep, Lambe, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal; and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter. Cheefe, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Pow-der, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any Bri. tifh Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belonging to Perfons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majefty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all fuch Articles as aforefaid, that fhall be imported with the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Port where the fame shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in an Act paffed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His prefent Majeky; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commillioners of His Majelty's Treafury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.
