\* PROCLAMATION for pardoning Deferters from His Majesty's Regular Land Forces.

War-Office, August 25, 1808.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the HEREAS it has been represented to the those who have already been guilty of that Crime King, that there are at this Time several may be aware of the daily Rilk they incur of De-

Deferters from the different Regular Corps in His Majesty's Land Service, who might be induced to? return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majesty's gracious Pardon, and that such an Instance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Instuence upon their future Behaviour; His Majesty has been graciously pleased to grant His Free Pardon to all Deferters from His Regular Land Forces, who shall furrender themselves on or before the Twenty-fourth Day of October, to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations

are mentioned in the Margin hereof, Durham. or to the Commandant of the Army Depot in the Ide of Wight.

Carlifle. Leeds. Such Deserters, if Able-bodied Manchester. Men, and fit for Service, shall be sent Nottingham: to the Regiments from which they Ipseuch. respectively deserted, or be appointed Ipfwich. Shrewfbury. to such Regiments in the United Birmingbam. Kingdom as His Majesty may be Hereforde. pleased to command; and when so placed, shall not be liable to be claim-Bedford. Maidstone. ed by any other Corps to which they. Gloucester. ·may formerly have belonged. Southampton.

And whereas many of the faid Deserters may have enlisted in other London. Regular Corps, and are now ferving therein, His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to such Deserters the Benefit of

this Pardon; and to direct that they shall continue to serve in the Corps wherein they now are, upon declaring themselves to their respective. Commanding Officers on or before the Twenty-fourth of October next, and they shall not be liable at any future Time to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly served.

The Magistrate to whom any Deserter from His Majesty's Regular Forces may surrender himself, is authorized and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deserter surrendered-himself; which Certificate is to continue in Force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the Head-Quarters of the nearest Military Post, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be certified by fome Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magistrate's Certificate, or to be otherwise proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer commanding at such

And, with a View to prevent as far as possible all Soldiers from Defertion after these His Majesty's most gracious Intentions shall be made known, His Majesty has been pleased to command, that the Name of every Soldier who may hereafter desert shall be transmitted, through the Secretary at War, to the Church Wardens of the Parishes to which the Deserrers belong, in order that their Names may be exposed to public View in the Church, or fuch other conspicuous Place as may render it impossible for Men, who have been guilty of this Crime, to return Home to their Friends, on whom they have brought Difgrace by their Misconduct, without immediate Detection; and His Majesty has further commanded that this Measure shall be made public, that every Soldier may be affured that the greatest Exertions will be used for the Apprehen-lion of any Man who may hereafter desert, and that
