contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Ads, of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them & And it will be observed, that such Penalties thereas the extend to those who are any ways concerned or informental in the Sending or Entieing. Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Informments when by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George T. Chap. 27.

F any Perfon shall contract with, entite, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brais, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominious, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Weltminster, or at the Affises or Quarter Seffions, he thall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprifoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Diferetion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid. If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any-luch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister, or Conful of Great Bri-. tain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Amballador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from chenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons a fhall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being . an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devife, or Purchafe, and thall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's ·Ufe, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Suffice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted on is preparing to go out of His Majelty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, fuch Juilice may fend his Warrant to bring the. Perlon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath . of One Witnels, or by Confellion, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he fhall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any s fuch Artificer thall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fach Promile, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid) he shall give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think, . reafonable, and shall be imprifoned till Security given. I

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Justiciary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Coston, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brais, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon In-dictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in Eng-, land, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer contracted with or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and thall fuffer Impriforment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in cafe of a lubfequent Offence of fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending the thall forfeit, for every Perlon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartiy wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch. Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Grown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every OF fence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weltminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majefty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utentils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly field to the belt Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Ufe of His Majefty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his Veffel, he shall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered
