Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the Directions of an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for rendering more commodious, and for better regulating the Port of London," that from and after the 9th Day of December 1808, the following Transit Rates in respect of the said Canal will become payable:

- For every Ship or Vessel, Lighter, Barge, or other Craft, laden or unloaden, entering the said Canal, if of Two Hundred Tons or upwards (Register Measurement), Two Pence per Ton.
- If of One Hundred Tons, and under Two Hundred, Three Half Pence per Ton.
- If of Fifty Tons, and under One Hundred, each Ten Shillings.
- All Vessels carrying Sail, if of Twenty Tons, and under Fifty Tons, each Five Shillings.
