HEREAS it appears by the Abiltracts of Wills and Letters of Administration, returned to the Stamp-Office from the several Ecclefiaffical Courts, that the Duties granted by the Acts of the 36 Geo 3. c. 52, 44 Geo. 3 c. 98, and 45 Geo. 3. c. 28, have not been paid in respect of divers Legacies and Annuities bequeathed by Will out of Personal or Real Edate, and in respect of divers Residues of Personal Estate given by Will, or devolved to Next of Kin upon Intestacies, particularly in Cases where the Executors were themfelves Legatees, or Reliduary Legatees, and where the Administrators were the sole Next of Kin of the Deceated:
