Navigation of the North Seas.

Notice is hereby given, that the Light on the Island of North Ronaldsay, in Orkney, North Lat. 59° 40' and West Longitude 2° 15' will be discontinued and cease to be lighted, from and after the 11th Day of June next 1809; but the revolving Light erected in 1806 upon the Start Point of the Island of Sanday, from which the Light on North
